Friday, June 21st 2019, 6 pm - midnight Saturday, June 22nd 2019, 3 - 11 pm Montmartre Site Cité internationale des arts The Cité internationale des arts presents a selection of works by its artists in residence as part of two open days., on its Montmartre site.

This ephemeral presentation at Villa Radet will give the public an overview of works produced by artists in residence at the Marais site, as part of an ongoing artistic project. To round off the exhibition, the artists who are currently in residence on the Montmartre site will be opening their studios to visitors and events in the gardens will celebrate the summer solstice.

This 2-day event brings together 39 artists of diverse background (South Africa, Germany, Saudi Arabia, Argentina, Bulgaria, China, Colombia, Congo, Egypt, Spain, the USA, France, Mauritius, India, Italy, Iran, Israel, Japan, Lebanon, Palestine, Peru, Portugal, Taiwan, Togo and Tunisia) who live and work in either the Marais or Montmartre sites in surroundings that foster exchange and collaboration. The themes that emerge across a wide range of artistic disciplines (painting, photography, drawing and calligraphy, installation, performance art, video, music) reflect current preoccupations and thinking on gender, history, contemporary political and demographic events, such as forced migration.

The artists come from different backgrounds and have different training and experience; some have already had international experience, while others are on the cusp of their professional career.

We invite you to come and meet the artists and discover works that comprise a multitude of different means of subjective expression.

The Villa Radet

Tucked away in the heart of Montmartre, just a stone's throw from the Sacré-Cœur, Villa Radet started life at the end of the 19th century as the home of the owner of the nearby Moulin Radet windmill. In 1835, the windmill was moved to the corner of Rue Lepic and Rue Girardon next to the Moulin Blute-Fin. The combined windmills would later become the famous "Moulin de la Galette" open-air dance hall.

Villa Radet next took on a new role, but remained faithful to this neighbourhood that had inspired poets, writers and many modern painters. In 1971, the villa was entrusted to the Cité internationale des arts as part of a lease agreement with the City of Paris, which owns the site, its gardens and adjacent buildings, to become a place to host artists in residence, their studios and workshops. The ensemble became the second site of the Foundation, a place where around forty artists from all over the world, working in a wide variety of disciplines, could have access for a fixed period to live-in studios attributed by committees held twice a year.

After major renovation work from 2017 to 2019 financed by City of Paris, Villa Radet — a truly unique and well-conserved location surrounded by magnificent gardens — is today alternately home to artists' studios and various events.



Ever since the Cité internationale des arts — private foundation recognized as a public utility — was founded in 1965, artists have been coming from all over the world to take part in our artist-in-residence programmes. The Cité encourages cross-cultural dialogue and provides a place where artists can meet with all publics, amateurs and professionals.

The Cité internationale des arts is located on two separate sites; the first is in Paris' Marais district and the second in Montmartre. Every month, in partnership with 135 French and international organisations, the Cité's two complementary sites welcome more than 300 artists from a wide range of disciplines for residencies lasting up to one year.
